Compatibility of Altus and Kontos with Beneficial Insects & Mites

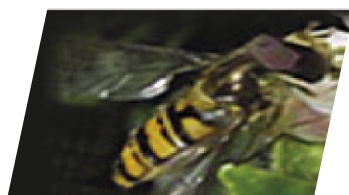

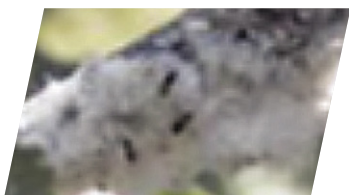

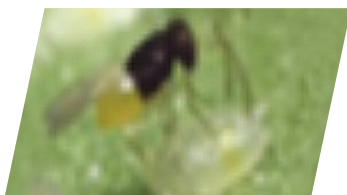
